Why should you attend?

A one day workshop focussed on educating and training staff to spot the signs of grooming behaviour. Ensuring that staff are aware of grooming behaviours which place children at risk is a key role for the safeguarding lead in any school. The workshop will cover safeguarding duties, particularly in relation to preventing/identifying unsuitable adults from working with children and techniques to help build resilience within your pupils in order that they are confident to resist inappropriate behaviour.
