ISIS CENSUS 1989 INTRODUCTION

Independent schools attracted a near record number of new pupils in 1988-89. This is the sixth successive rise recorded by ISIS and the second highest percentage increase.

There are 7,541 more children at schools in membership of National ISIS in 1989 – a rise of 1.7 per cent compared with last year. The biggest increase is in preparatory schools.

The figures are based on Census returns from schools in January 1989. These record 460,031 pupils attending the 1,347 schools in the United Kingdom and Eire which took part in the survey (Table 1).

Comparisons are made between the 1,323 schools which participated in both the 1988 and 1989 surveys. In these schools there were 452,768 pupils aged between 2 and 19, compared with 445,227 a year ago. (Table 2).

Eighty per cent of all independently-educated pupils are in the 1,378 schools which are members of National ISIS. (Altogether more than 580,000 children are educated in 2,500 independent schools in the UK and Eire).

Department of Education and Science figures demonstrate that independent schools are educating an increasing proportion of the school population. This proportion was 5.8 per cent overall 10 years ago and is now more than seven per cent. The proportions vary in different age groups and in different parts of the British Isles. At sixth-form level, for example, the independent sector is educating 19 per cent of the 16-18 year-old age group.

This increasing 'market share' is due to the continuing decline in the number of children of school age nationally. In 1987-88, according to the Department of Education & Science, maintained sector secondary school rolls fell by 5.5 per cent and primary rolls rose by 1.4 per cent. Secondary rolls will continue to drop until 1991.

GIRLS CATCHING UP THE BOYS

The Census confirms the increasing popularity of independent education for girls. The number of girls went up in 1988-89 by 2.3 per cent and the number of boys by 1.2 per cent.

This confirms the trend of recent years; the proportion of girls in ISIS schools has risen from 41.7 per cent in 1982 to 44.6 per cent this year. The development reflects in part the increasing popularity of coeducation, though demand for single-sex girls' schools remains strong and the number of girls in these schools has also increased.

MORE DAY PUPILS

The Census records an increase of 9,100 day pupils (2.7 per cent). The increase is particularly marked at the extreme ends of the age range – in preparatory schools and sixth forms.

THE PREP SCHOOL SUCCESS STORY

This year's Census provides further evidence that preparatory schools are a national success story. Parents in ever larger numbers want what they provide – small classes, good discipline, purposeful learning. For these and demographic reasons, the expansion of the independent sector continues to be largely due to the schools represented in IAPS and ISAI and in other junior schools.

The most spectacular increases in pupil numbers occur in the early and middle years of the age range catered for by prep schools and their pre-prep departments. The number of three-year-olds is now more than 7,400 and the number of four-year-olds exceeds 13,400.

Children aged between two and eight years old increased in number by 4,584 or 4.8 per cent. Since most of these young recruits will continue through the full prep school stage they are the best possible news for this part of the independent sector. The number of nine-year-olds, for example, increased by 6.9 per cent this year. (Table 3).

UPS & DOWNS OF BOARDING

Weekly boarding is increasingly popular. There is ample evidence that it is attractive to parents who have no previous experience of boarding education. They may be working parents who value it because they are able to see their children at weekends and know that the schools cater fully for their academic and extra-curricular needs during the week. They may be urban families unable to find places in their first choice day schools who welcome the wider range of choice which weekly boarding within easy reach of home offers them.

This is the third Census in which we have recorded the number of weekly boarders separately. The number – 9,746 – has increased by 9.4 per cent. (Table 2).

The number of full boarders, which has fallen steadily throughout the post-war period, has dropped by an overall 2.4 per cent (boys down by 2.8 per cent, girls by 1.6 per cent).

SCHOOLS HELP MORE CHILDREN

More children than ever before in independent schools are receiving help from various sources towards their fees. The rise is almost entirely attributable to increasing help from the schools themselves through bursaries and scholarships. The total who are being helped in these ways is now 63,277, representing 14 per cent of all children in ISIS-member schools and an increase during the year of 4,993 pupils or 8.6 per cent.

Taking into account a drop in the number of places paid for by local education authorities, there is a net rise of 4,351 children receiving help, taking the total to 103,905. They represent 23.5 per cent of all children in our schools – nearly a quarter.

FEE RISE SLOWS DOWN

Fees rose by an average of 10 per cent – slightly less than in the previous two years when schools were absorbing the full effects of larger than usual increases in teachers' pay. (Table 6).

The rise in average earnings over the year was 9.4 per cent. The overall average increase in teachers' pay nationally was 6.3 per cent, but this probably understates the effects of incremental rises. These are more significant comparisons than the retail prices index (which increased by almost five per cent) because staff salaries account for well over half the expenditure of independent as well as maintained schools. Increases in fees are therefore largely a reflection of generous staffing in independent schools and updating of buildings and equipment.

IMPROVED TEACHER:PUPIL RATIO

The average teacher:pupil ratio across all schools has improved even further from 1:11.6 to 1:11.4. In senior

schools there has been an improvement from 1:13.5 to 1:13.3. (Table 2).

BIG SPENDING ON BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Substantial increases are recorded in schools' expenditure on new buildings and improvements to buildings and equipment in 1988. They spent a total of £106.5 million, an increase of £25.6 million over the previous year. This was equivalent to £374 per pupil, compared with £301 in 1987, and represents a rise of 24 per cent. (Table 8).

As well as schools' constant upgrading of their facilities, another reason for the big increase may have been their wish to complete building projects before the April 1989 deadline after which VAT is payable so as to comply with the European Court judgement on non-domestic buildings.

FEWER CHILDREN FROM OVERSEAS

There is little change in the number of pupils whose parents are serving in HM Forces, but there are 2,017 fewer British and foreign children whose parents live overseas. This is a larger drop than last year.

The proportion of foreign pupils in UK independent schools is below three per cent but their fees are estimated to be worth £70 million to Britain in foreign currency. This does not include their other expenditure while in this country.

NEW TABLES

There are three new tables in this year's Census. They show the number of schools in each category of size, according to the number of pupils (Table 11 on page 15), the number of schools with specific percentages of boarders (Table 12 on page 16) and the number of schools with the proportions of boys and girls (Table 13 on page 16).

GENERAL AND ASSOCIATION TABLES

Please note that all the general tables are contained on pages 6 to 16. The tables which follow (pages 18 to 40) relate to particular Associations of schools, indicated by the initials at the top of each page.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Census forms were received this year from all but 31 of the eligible 1,378 schools. I am grateful to the Heads, Deputy Heads, Bursars, Secretaries and other members of staff of the schools which co-operated and to the Chairmen, President and Secretaries of the Associations listed on page two.

Julian Bewick and the staff of Monkton Combe Computing Service have worked long hours with great patience and tenacity to produce their survey. They are to be congratulated on producing a document which is widely valued – by journalists, commentators, researchers, educationalists and by the schools themselves – for the detailed information it provides on the major part of the independent sector. THE INDEPENDENT SECTOR

Figures for pupils at all independent schools in England and Wales and for Great Britain as a whole, based on Department of Education & Science and Scottish Education Department statistics, are available from National ISIS. NOTES ON TABLES FOR INDIVIDUAL ASSOCIATIONS

Tables on the following pages show changes that occurred between January 1988 and January 1989.

In order that fair comparisons can be made, only those schools which completed the census in BOTH years have figures included in the tables.

A few schools changed the associations to which they belong during the year between the two census days. Their figures are included in tables for their current associations.

Age ranges for schools in England, Wales and Ireland are calculated using 1st September as a base. Those in Scotland use 1st January.

Tables 14A to 19A show numbers of pupils in the schools. Current numbers are shown in bold print, with last year's figures printed below. Percentage changes are printed as the third line of each group of three lines. In cases of large percentage change, it is wise to look at the figures above to see if the change is significant.

TABLES 14B to 19B show the numbers of pupils and the average fees by areas. A blank entry in a fees or numbers column indicates that there is no school of the relevant category in the area. A blank in the per cent change row means there is no significant change.

TABLES 14C, D and E to 19C, D and E deal with staffing.

TABLES 14F and G to 19F and G deal with numbers and courses of study of sixth form pupils.

TABLES 14H, I and J to 19H, I and J show the sources of entry and destination of leavers. Proportions shown in each category are believed to be accurate, but total numbers are higher than those shown. These tables are amongst the most difficult for schools to complete accurately as sources and destinations are not always known.
