Statistical Survey of Independent Schools - January 1987

These tables contain information derived from a survey carried out in January 1987 among members of:-

- HMC - predominantly boys' schools whose heads are members of the Headmasters' Conference
- SHMIS - predominantly boys' schools whose heads are members of the Society of Headmasters of Independent Schools
- GBA - predominantly boys' schools whose governing bodies are members of the Governing Bodies Association but not also of HMC or SHMIS
- GSA - girls' schools whose heads are members of the Girls' Schools Association and of GBGSA
- GBGSA - girls' schools whose governing bodies are members of the Governing Bodies of Girls' Schools Association but not also of GSA
- IAPS - boys' and girls' schools whose heads are members of the Incorporated Association of Preparatory Schools
- ISAI - boys' and girls' schools whose heads are members of the Independent Schools Association Incorporated but not also of GBA, GBGSA or IAPS

The information relates to January 1987, except that expenditure on buildings and equipment is for the financial year ending at various dates in 1986.

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THE 1987 ISIS CENSUS

INTRODUCTION

Independent schools in 1986 had a record year. They increased their number of pupils for the fourth year in succession - and the increase is larger than ever before. The number of boarding pupils has risen for the first time since ISIS surveys began 14 years ago.

The 1987 Census returns from schools in membership of National ISIS show an increase of more than 9,000 pupils in the past year (compared with 5,000 in the previous year). This is a rise of 2.2 per cent - almost double the increase in the previous year and the biggest boost in numbers ever recorded.

On Census day in January 1987 there were 440,864 pupils attending the 1,342 schools in the United Kingdom and Eire which took part in the survey (Table 1). However, comparisons are based on the 1,299 schools which participated in both the 1986 and 1987 surveys. In these schools, there were 430,254 pupils aged between two and 19, compared with 420,989 a year ago - 2.2 per cent more. (Table 2).

Throughout the UK and Eire there are more than 2,500 independent schools with 550,000 children. Over half of these schools, containing 80 per cent of the pupils, are members of National ISIS.

The proportion of the total school population being educated in independent schools has risen steadily from 5.8 per cent eight years ago to almost seven per cent now. At sixth-form level, independent schools cater for more than 17 per cent of the total school population.

The number of children of school age continues to fall nationally. According to the Department of Education and Science, maintained secondary school rolls have fallen by 3.9 per cent in the past

year, while primary rolls have increased by 0.35 per cent. (Between now and the early 1990s, the secondary school population will continue to drop and primary numbers will rise).

DAY AND BOARDING NUMBERS UP

For the first time since the ISIS Census began, there has been an increase in the number of boarders - a rise of 207 to 109,379. This is due to the continuing increase in girl boarders exceeding a smaller decrease than usual in boys. (Weekly boarders are also increasing but a comparison will not be possible until next year because weekly boarding figures have been recorded separately for the first time in this Census). Day boys increased by 4,564 (2.7 per cent) and day girls by 4,494 (3.2 per cent) - a total rise of 9,058 or 3 per cent. (Table 2).

A detailed breakdown of children by ages between 2 and 19 shows that pupils have been gained at every age except 10, 13 and 14. It also confirms the continuing growth of pre-preparatory age children (two to seven-year-olds) in independent schools. The number of these children has grown by more than 4,000 (6.5 per cent) and exceeds last year's increase (Table 14a).

FEES ARE UP

The overall average increase in fees was about 11 per cent, compared with nine per cent in 1985. Since most educational expenditure - whether in independent or maintained schools - goes on staff, the main factor in the increase is teachers' pay. Most schools have been phasing in the increases which are due to be paid in the state sector. (Table 3).

Increases in educational costs always exceed the general level of inflation (which was 3.9 per cent in 1986) because schools are labour and capital intensive. The national average increase in earnings for 1986 was 7.5 per cent.

The teacher/pupil ratio remains at an overall average across all schools of 1:11.7. In senior schools it is 1:13.6 (Table 2).

.... AND MORE CHILDREN ARE BEING HELPED

The Census shows another increase in the number of pupils receiving help from various sources towards their fees - a rise of 2,633 to 83,549. More than half of these children (43,991) are being helped by the schools themselves in the forms of bursaries and scholarships. They represent over 10 per cent of children in ISIS-member schools.

MORE INVESTED IN BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Total expenditure on new buildings and equipment and improvements to buildings in 1986 was £124,700,000 - an increase of £16.6 million over 1985. This is equivalent to £289 per pupil (compared with £257 in 1985) and represents a bigger percentage rise (12.5 per cent) than in the previous year. (Table 5).

MORE FORCES CHILDREN, FEWER FROM OVERSEAS

There are 427 more children of British parents serving in the armed forces, totalling 15,768, but 1,216 fewer children of British civilian parents living overseas. (Table 6).

The total number of children whose parents live abroad (excluding forces families) continues to fall. The number of foreign pupils in UK independent schools is down by 364 (a steeper drop than in 1985) and falls to 3.1 per cent of the total school population in the Census. Foreign pupil numbers have dropped from every part of the world except those whose homes are in the Middle East and Europe. The fees of the 13,289 foreign pupils are estimated to be worth £58 million to Britain in foreign currency.

CONCLUSION

It would be hard to imagine a more consistently encouraging picture of the health of independent schools than this Census.

The gains in day pupils which have been a feature of ISIS surveys for the past three years have now been confirmed even more impressively, and boarding numbers are up for the first time for many years.

In what is almost certainly a general election year, all political parties should digest the message of this Census. This is that independent schools are increasingly attractive to parents. Their proportion of the school population continues to rise. They appeal to all age groups and are increasingly successful in recruiting younger children. The social and educational mix of pupils continues to widen - not least because of the increasing proportion who receive help with fees, particularly from the schools themselves.

We know that independent schools are sustained by general public support. This support is far wider than those who have a direct stake in them. It embraces three-quarters of the electorate and clear majorities of all social groups, all age groups and supporters of all political parties. Attempts to abolish these schools - or to take measures which would make them more socially exclusive - would meet fierce hostility.

In saying this, I am not defending a narrow corner of education. Independent schools make a contribution to the nation's education which is utterly disproportionate to their numerical strength. In their spending on educational resources - whether on teaching staff or books or equipment - they also provide useful ammunition for the maintained sector in its case for education as a higher priority area in public expenditure.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

NOTES ON TABLES FOR INDIVIDUAL ASSOCIATIONS

Tables on the following pages show changes that occurred between January 1986 and January 1987.

In order that fair comparisons can be made, only those schools which completed the census in BOTH years have figures included in the tables.

A few schools changed the associations to which they are affiliated during the year between the two census days. Their figures are included in tables for their current associations.

Age ranges for schools in England, Wales and Ireland are calculated using 1st September as a base. Those in Scotland use 1st January.

Tables 8A to 14A show numbers of pupils in the schools. Current numbers are shown in bold print, with last year's figures printed below. Percentage changes are printed as the third line of each group of three lines. In cases of large percentage change, it is wise to look at the figures above to see if the change is significant. Numbers of weekly boarders are included for the first time this year. Comparisons with 1986 are not available, so weekly boarding numbers have been added to those for full boarding for the purpose of comparison.

TABLES 8B to 14B show the numbers of pupils and the average fees by areas. A blank entry in a fees or numbers column implies that there is no school of the relevant category in the area. A blank in the per cent change row means there is no significant change.

TABLES 8C to 13C have not been printed this year. They have been combined into one table (TABLE 14C), which shows the spread of maximum termly boarding and day fees by associations to the nearest £50.

TABLES 8D,E and F to 13D, E and F show the sources of entry and destination of leavers. Proportions shown in each category are believed to be accurate, but total numbers are higher than those shown. These tables are amongst the most difficult for schools to complete accurately as sources and destinations are not always known.

TABLES 8G, H and I to 13 G, H and I deal with staffing.

TABLES 8J and K to 13J and K deal with numbers and courses of study of sixth form pupils.
