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NOTES ON THE 1984 ISIS CENSUS

INTRODUCTION

Pupil Numbers increase

For the first time since 1981 pupil numbers at independent schools are on the increase. The results of the 1984 Census are most encouraging for schools in membership of the leading associations of fee-paying schools in Britain. Numbers are up by more than 1,000 from 407,664 to 408,672 at nearly 1,300 schools - an increase of 0.25%. This welcome news could herald the end of the recession as far as independent education is concerned.

At any event it is a remarkable achievement and a welcome sign of confidence among fee-paying parents. At a time when a recent report estimated that 12,500 companies went into liquidation during 1983, when the Government estimates that the total school population is still falling at the rate of 3% per year, and when the number of pupils from overseas going to independent schools in Britain is still dropping, the independent sector is buoyant.

Highlights of this year's census

The main findings are contained in table 2 on page 7 which compares numbers of pupils at 1,297 schools which took part in both the January 1983 and 1984 surveys.

Increase in girls

The number of girls has increased by more than 2,000 to a total of 172,000 or 42% of pupils at ISIS schools as compared to 37% a decade ago. The traditional boys' schools

(where the headmasters are in membership of HMC) account for half this increase. This has not been at the expense of the girls' schools because they too have put on numbers, but it has meant that the number of boys at boys' schools has dropped slightly.

Day pupils up

Day pupils are up by more than 2,500. This increase is to be found throughout the schools and not just at those secondary schools which are taking part in the Government's Assisted Places Scheme. In fact the association with the biggest percentage increase of nearly 0.7% is the Independent Schools Association Incorporated whose member schools are for the most part not in the scheme. The number of boarders has dropped with particular losses among boarding boys but gains among boarding girls.

Fee rises slowing up

Fees are still continuing to rise at a faster rate than inflation. Table 3 on page 8 shows the average increases for each association. The overall average fees increase at member schools was 1.8% as compared with an inflation rate of 5.1%. But fees are no longer running at twice the rate of inflation as recorded last year. The background of increasing fees makes the increases in pupil numbers appear even more remarkable.

More assisted places

More and more pupils are being helped with school fees: schools have increased their numbers of scholarships and bursaries by 2,800 or by nearly 8%. More than 4,000 more pupils at the schools in the survey are now being helped under the Government's Assisted Places Scheme, introduced in 1982 to help families with able children of secondary school age. But this increase is almost completely offset by a drop of 3,800 in the places paid for by local education authorities. Of the 12,800 local authority places, nearly one third are in Northern Ireland.

Overseas pupils down

In previous years increases in pupil numbers have been accounted for by rises in the number of pupils coming from

overseas to schools in Britain. But this time both the number of British and Foreign pupils living overseas and boarding at British schools has dropped slightly. The number of Iranian pupils for example has dropped from nearly 1,500 in 1978 to 293 in 1983. But there is continuing to be an increase in Asians East of Iran coming to schools in Britain particularly from Hong Kong and Malaysia (see table 6 on page 11).

Foreign pupils now earn £47 million a year in foreign currency from fees alone. The total number of foreign pupils (about 13,000) is only about 3.1% of the total school population in the survey and they account for about one boarder in 10.

Service children up

More children from the Armed Services are coming to independent schools in membership. The number now exceeds 14,000 and there are a further 3,000 at other independent schools in England and Wales. But the number at National ISIS schools has increased by 600 or 4.4%.

Sixth form leavers

Total numbers aged 16 and over and therefore in the sixth forms of schools in the survey increased from 65,827 in 1983 to 66,223 in 1984. Schools have weathered the switch from the independent sector to maintained sixth form and tertiary colleges. Numbers of pupils switching from HMC schools to maintained schools at age 15 and over increased from 2,302 in 1983 to 2,690 in 1983. Numbers at girls' schools in membership of GSA/GBGSA increased from 2,122 in 1982 to 2,762 in 1983.

One interesting change - although it is too early to state whether or not it is significant - is that although the percentage of leavers going on to higher education remains about the same (see table 7 on page 12) the percentage of pupils going to universities has dropped slightly while there has been a corresponding increase in the proportion going to polytechnics and other forms of higher education. For example: the percentage of leavers from HMC schools going on to universities has dropped from 44% to 42%.

Confidence high

Increasing signs of high confidence among member schools are to be found in the figures for the amounts spent on buildings and equipment (nearly £200 per pupil a year). Total

figures have risen from £75.4m in 1982 to £81.4m in 1983 (see table 5 on page 10) - an increase of 8% which is higher than the rate of inflation.

New information

For the first time the census includes a break down of average fees and numbers of pupils by areas for each association. These tables are described in a commentary on page 13. There is also a table showing the overall picture for all schools at the end of this booklet.

Thanks

We received returns from all but 10 of the 1,345 schools in membership of the associations which sponsor National ISIS. This is a record return which should enable next year's comparative census to top the 1,300 mark. I am particularly grateful to schools themselves, their Heads and Deputy Heads, Bursars, Staff and Secretaries for their time and trouble and to the Chairmen and Secretaries of the Associations listed on page 2. Thanks are also due to Julian Bewick and his staff at Monkton Combe Computing Service, and to John Widdowson, Headmaster of Keil School, Scotland.

The 1,354 schools in membership of National ISIS form just over half of the 2,500 independent schools in the United Kingdom, but they educate about three-quarters of the pupils at them. Figures for all pupils at independent schools, based on the Department of Education and Science statistics, may be obtained from National ISIS. SUMMARY - MAIN FINDINGS

- 1 Pupils up by 1,000 - first increase since 1981
2. Girls increased by 2,000 to 42% of total.
3. Day pupils up; Foreign pupils and boarders down.
4. Fees increased by 8% - still higher than inflation.
5. Scholarships and bursaries up by 8%.

NOTES ON TABLES FOR INDIVIDUAL ASSOCIATIONS

Tables on the following pages show changes which occurred between January 1983 and January 1984.

In order that true comparisons can be made, only those schools which completed the census in BOTH years have figures included in the tables.

The small number of schools which changed affiliation during the year have their figures included in the tables of their current associations.

Age ranges for schools in England, Wales and Ireland are calculated using 1st September as a base. Those in Scotland use 1st January.

TABLES 8A to 13A show numbers of pupils in the schools. The current numbers is shown in **BOLD** print, with last year's figures printed below. The percentage change is printed as the third line of each group of three lines. In cases of large percentage change, it is wise to look at the figures above to see if the change is significant. TABLE 14A on page 38 groups this information for all associations in one table.

TABLES 8B to 13B show the numbers of pupils and average fees by areas. A blank entry in a fees column implies that there is no school of the relevant category in the area. A blank in the % change row means the change, if any, is less than 0.05%. Table 14B on page 39 groups this information together for all associations.

TABLES 8C to 13C show the spread of fees within each association.

TABLES 8D,E,F to 13D,E,F show the sources of entry and destination of leavers.

TABLES 8G,H,I to 13G,H,I deal with staffing.

TABLES 8J,K to 13J,K deal with courses of study of sixth form pupils. The tables (K) for Scotland have been added this year.

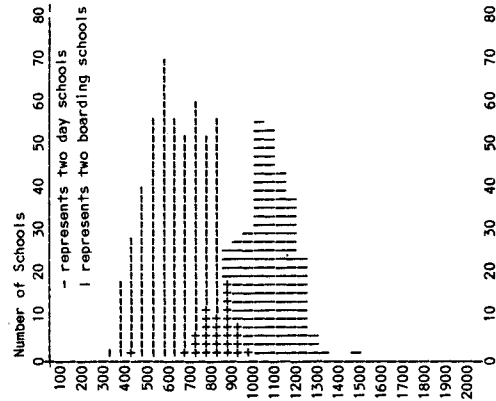
