#### THE 1988 ISIS CENSUS

#### INTRODUCTION

Independent schools go from strength to strength. In 1987-88 they attracted more pupils for the fifth year in succession.

Schools in membership of National ISIS gained more than 5,500 pupils during the year. This is a rise of 1.3 per cent, which is the second highest recorded increase.

On Census day in January 1988 there were 454,003 pupils attending the 1,365 schools in the United Kingdom and Eire which took part in the survey (Table 1). However, comparisons are based on the 1,342 schools which participated in both the 1987 and 1988 surveys. In these schools, there were 443,368 pupils aged between two and 19, compared with 437,783 a year ago - 1.3 per cent more (Table 2).

There are 2,500 independent schools educating more than 560,000 children in the UK and Eire. Over half of these schools, containing 80 per cent of the pupils, are members of National ISIS.

As the number of children of school age continues to fall nationally, the proportion of the total school population being educated in independent schools is rising steadily. This proportion was 5.8 per cent nine years ago and is just over seven per cent now. The overall proportion, however, conceals the full contribution of the independent sector to the education of pupils between 16 and 18. Eighteen per cent of this sixth-form age group are being educated in independent schools.

(According to the Department of Education and Science, secondary school rolls in the maintained sector fell by 4.4 per cent in the year 1986-7 and primary school rolls increased by 0.8 per cent. Secondary school pupil numbers will not begin to rise until 1992).

#### DAY AND WEEKLY BOARDING NUMBERS UP

The Census records an increase of 7,693 day pupils (2.3 per cent). Of these, 4,400 are girls - a rise of 2.9 per cent - and 3,293 are boys, a rise of almost 2 per cent. (Table 2).

The decline in the number of full boarders, which appeared to have been reversed in last year's Census, has resumed. The overall drop is 2.2 per cent (boys down by 3.2 per cent, girls by 0.5 per cent).

On the other hand, weekly boarding is increasingly popular. We began to record the number of weekly boarders in last year's survey and comparison is therefore possible for the first time in this Census. There are 8,786 weekly boarders, an increase of nearly 2 per cent. (Table 2).

#### ENCOURAGEMENT FOR PREP SCHOOLS

The age profile of children in the survey confirms the strength of parental demand for nursery, kindergarten and primary education in the increasing number of pre-preparatory departments. The number of pupils aged between two and eight rose by 4,554 or 5.0 per cent. This is particularly encouraging for preparatory schools, as most of these new and very young recruits to the independent sector will stay on and progress through the prep schools and beyond. There was, for example, an increase of 6.5 per cent in the number of eight-year-olds this year. (Table 14a).

#### FEE RISE IS HELD

Fees rose by an average of 11 per cent - the same as in 1986-87. (Table 3). The rise in average earnings over the year was 7.7 per cent. This is a more relevant comparison than the retail prices index (which increased by 3.3 per cent) because staff salaries account for most school costs in both the independent and maintained sectors. The increase in fees is therefore mainly a reflection of independent schools' generous staffing policy and adoption of the teachers' salaries and 'Baker scales' awarded a year ago, together with investment in buildings and equipment.

#### MORE HELP FOR PUPILS

The Census reveals a further increase in the number of pupils receiving help from various sources towards their fees - a rise of more than 13,500 to 98,619 (just over 22 per cent, or more than one child in five). Thirteen per cent of all children in the schools surveyed (57,148) are being helped by the schools themselves through bursaries and scholarships.

The Census shows more than 28,000 pupils in the Government Assisted Places Scheme, an increase of over 2,000, but fewer places paid for by local education authorities.

#### BETTER TEACHER : PUPIL RATIO

The average teacher: pupil ratio across all schools has improved slightly from 1:11.7 to 1:11.6. In senior schools there has been a similar improvement from 1:13.6 to 1:13.5.

#### IMPROVED BUILDINGS & EQUIPMENT

Schools spent £130.9 million on new buildings and improvements to buildings and equipment in 1987 - an increase of £4.6 million over the previous year. This was equivalent to £295 per pupil, compared with £288 in 1986, and represents a rise of 2.4 per cent. (Table 5).

#### FORCES UP. OVERSEAS DOWN

There are 270 more children of British parents serving in HM Forces, totalling 16,287, but 872 fewer children of British civilian parents living overseas. (Table 6)

The proportion of foreign pupils in UK independent schools has dropped to just below 3 per cent. There are now 12,711 in the schools surveyed (827 fewer than a year ago); their fees are estimated to be worth £65 million to Britain in foreign currency.

#### RECORD NUMBER OF SCHOOLS IN ISIS

There are now 1,382 schools belonging to the Associations which sponsor National ISIS. This is 23 more than a year ago and a record number.

#### CONCLUSION

The increasing attractiveness of independent schools to parents is again confirmed. The independent sector's success in gaining new pupils is sustained. The infusion of very young pupils continues and promises well for preparatory schools.

While day and weekly boarding numbers increase, the steady decline in full boarders continues; anecdotal evidence suggests that the drop is occurring where full boarding accounts for only a minority of pupils rather than at schools which are entirely or predominantly boarding. Fee rises have been held to about the same level as in the previous year for the first time for several years, reflecting schools' policy of phasing in the teachers' salary award over two years.

As the Education Reform Bill progresses through Parliament, independent schools are well placed to compete successfully in the more challenging environment which it will create in the 1990s. They represent variety and choice in an education system which will have more of both. Independent schools are familiar with healthy competition, with 'local financial management', with regular testing and with the importance of a clearly stated curriculum. Above all, parents continue to recognise the quality of education they provide for children of all abilities.

#### ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Census forms were received this year from all but 17 of the eligible 1,382 schools. I am grateful to the Heads, Deputy Heads, Bursars, Secretaries and other members of staff of these schools and to the Chairmen, President and Secretaries of the Associations listed on page two. NOTES ON TABLES FOR INDIVIDUAL ASSOCIATIONS

Tables on the following pages show changes that occurred between January 1987 and January 1988.

In order that fair comparisons can be made, only those schools which completed the census in BOTH years have figures included in the tables.

A few schools changed the associations to which they are affiliated during the year between the two census days. Their figures are included in tables for their current associations.

Age ranges for schools in England, Wales and Ireland are calculated using 1st September as a base. Those in Scotland use 1st January.

Tables 8A to 14A show numbers of pupils in the schools. Current numbers are shown in bold print, with last year's figures printed below. Percentage changes are printed as the third line of each group of three lines. In cases of large percentage change, it is wise to look at the figures above to see if the change is significant.

TABLES 8B to 14B show the numbers of pupils and the average fees by areas. A blank entry in a fees or numbers column implies that there is no school of the relevant category in the area. A blank in the per cent change row means there is no significant change.

TABLES 8C, D and E to 13 C, D and E deal with staffing.

TABLES 8F and G to 13F and G deal with numbers and courses of study of sixth form pupils.

TABLES 8H, I and J to 13H, I and J show the sources of entry and destination of leavers. Proportions shown in each category are believed to be accurate, but total numbers are higher than those shown. These tables are amongst the most difficult for schools to complete accurately as sources and destinations are not always known.

TABLE 14C shows the spread of maximum termly boarding and day fees for each Association.
