# **ISC Annual Census 2015**

The ISC Annual Census was carried out in January 2015. All 1,267 schools in UK membership of the constituent associations completed the survey. The Census covers 517,113 pupils and provides a detailed snapshot of the schools and of the wider social and economic trends in the UK.



# **Pupils**

# 517,113

Pupil numbers have now exceeded the previous pre-recession high and stand at their **highest level** since records began in 1974.




# New pupils

# 104,478

New pupils at ISC schools. **Over** a **quarter** of new pupils to ISC schools joined from the state-funded sector.





### Global Reach

### 27,211

Non-British pupils whose parents live overseas. In addition, there are a further **16,821 pupils** whose parents live in the UK. Collectively, non-British pupils make up **8.5%** of all ISC pupils.

#### Fee Assistance

### £700m

Fee assistance provided annually by ISC schools. Overall, **33.3%** of all pupils receive assistance with their fees.

### **Bursaries**

# 5,406

Pupils who are currently on full bursaries, meaning they pay no fees at all. **42.2%** of pupils on bursaries have more than half of their fees remitted.

# **Pupil-Teacher Ratio**

### 9.2

Pupils for every teacher on average at ISC schools. There is a total number of **56,295** full-time equivalent teachers.



# **Partnerships**

### 93%

ISC schools involved in partnerships with state schools or the wider community.



#### Charitable Work

### 98%

ISC schools that raised funds for charities. More than £15 million was raised by schools.









### SEND

### 66,026

The number of pupils at ISC schools who have been identified as having special educational needs and/or a disability (SEND).

### Termly Fees

### 3.5%

The lowest annual fee rise since 1994. The overall average termly fee is **£5,099**.

### **Ethnic Diversity**

#### 29.1%

ISC pupils who are from a minority ethnic background and this varies regionally, as in Britain as a whole.

### **Higher Education**

### 92.0%

Pupils who leave ISC schools and go on to Higher Education. **4%** of this cohort chose to continue their education beyond the UK.
