


ISC Annual Census 2016

The ISC Annual Census was carried out in January 2016. All 1,280 schools in UK membership of the constituent associations completed the survey. The Census covers 518,432 pupils and provides a detailed snapshot of the schools and of the wider social and economic trends in the UK.



Pupils

518,432

Pupil numbers have now exceeded the previous pre-recession high and stand at their **highest level** since records began in 1974.



New pupils

103,126

New pupils at ISC schools. **Over a quarter** of new pupils to ISC schools joined from the state-funded sector.



Global Reach

27,633

Non-British pupils whose parents live overseas. There are **46** overseas campuses operated by ISC schools. **4%** of pupils choose to study at universities outside the UK.



Termly Fees

3.5%

The lowest annual fee rise since 1994. The overall average termly fee is **£5,245**.

Fee Assistance

£728m

Fee assistance provided annually by ISC schools. Overall, **31.8%** of all pupils receive assistance with their fees.

Means-tested Assistance

5,629

Pupils who pay no fees at all. Over **40%** of pupils receiving means-tested assistance have more than half of their fees remitted.

Value Added



The attainment gap of pupils at ISC schools existing at GCSE when allowing for prior ability, socio-economic status and gender.

Higher Education

92.0%

Pupils who leave ISC schools and go on to Higher Education. The majority, **56%**, continue to a Russell Group university of which **6%** choose to study at Oxbridge.



Partnerships

160,000

Pupils at state schools who benefit from their own school's partnership with ISC schools.



Charitable Work

99%

ISC schools that raised funds for charities. Around **£15 million** was raised by schools.



Pupil-Teacher Ratio

8.7

Pupils for every teacher on average at ISC schools. There is a total number of **56,650** full-time equivalent teachers.

SEND

68,441

The number of pupils at ISC schools who have been identified as having special educational needs and/or a disability (SEND).

Ethnic Diversity

30.3%

ISC pupils who are from a minority ethnic background and this varies regionally, as in Britain as a whole.
