GBGSA	- girls' schools, whose governing bodies are members of the Association of Governing Bodies of Girls' Public Schools
IAPS	- predominantly boys' schools, whose headmasters are members of the Incorporated Association of Preparatory Schools
AHMPS	 girls' schools, whose headmistresses are members of the Association of Head Mistresses of Girls' Preparatory Schools

The survey was taken on 31 January 1974. The information provided, therefore, relates mainly to the 1973 academic year.

- NOTES (1) The statistics given are derived only from those schools whose returns have been received by ISIS. They therefore represent 100% of HMC and IAPS schools, 72% of SHMIS schools, 95% of GBGSA schools and 82% of AHMPS schools.
 - (2) In calculating these 'weighted' ratios, Heads of schools are not counted, two part-time teachers are counted as one full-time, and each sixth-form pupil is counted as two. This is the basis used by the Department of Education and Science for calculating staff/pupil ratios.

The figures given represent the <u>average</u> ratio for each category of school. They may vary upwards or downwards for individual schools (e.g. HMC ratios range between 1:14.3 and 1:19.9).
