


# ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic Scholarships are open to all students, regardless of previous educational background. Current students and those joining for the first time will be considered.

Reddam House Berkshire Academic Scholars may be strong across a wide variety of subjects, or perhaps particularly able in a more specific area, such as Maths, Science, Modern Languages, or English. Critically, our Scholars perform exceptionally well and score the highest grades in their admissions tests and interviews. Pupils will be assessed for their talent and potential.

Eligible candidates will demonstrate a fine work ethic, produce work on time with high standards of presentation and content, as well as excellent behaviour and participation in class. Our Scholars take the lead and help others to aspire to academic excellence by being avid readers of both fiction and non-fiction literature in their areas of interest and taking full advantage of the breadth and depth of academic experience on offer at Reddam House Berkshire, taking up intellectual challenges beyond the norm, such as teaching themselves additional skills and knowledge, extra research, visits, and presentations.





#### **MUSIC**

Reddam House Berkshire offers Music Scholarships to students who show considerable musical promise. Candidates must present a high degree of musical ability, and potential for leadership in the encouragement of non-award holding musicians. Auditions will be adjudicated by a panel including the Director of Senior Music and the Director of Junior Music.

Award recipients should choose Music as a GCSE option and, for the scholarship to continue into Sixth Form, they must continue with Music.

#### **DANCE**

Dance Scholarships are offered to students who demonstrate outstanding commitment to dance, technical competence, and strong expressive skills. Candidates are urged to apply only if they have a genuine commitment to the subject and practice. Award recipients must be available for occasions during evenings and weekends and become a Performing Arts Leader in the school either through an elected position, coaching or mentoring of younger students, or otherwise taking a leading role in the Dance Department.

Dance Scholars should choose Dance as a GCSE option and, for the scholarship to continue into Sixth Form, they must continue with Dance.

#### **DRAMA**

Drama is a core part of a Reddam House Berkshire education and becoming a Drama Scholar is an exciting way to take part in a number of activities throughout the year, and allows students to develop their passion in theatre and the performing arts. Candidates must show a high degree of acting ability, as well as experience and knowledge of the theatre world. A second skill in either playwriting, directing, or theatre design is advantageous. Award recipients must become a Performing Arts Leader in the school either through an elected position, coaching or mentoring of younger students, or otherwise taking a leading role in the Drama Department.

Award recipients should choose Drama as a GCSE option and, for the scholarships to continue into Sixth Form, they must pursue Theatre Studies at A Level.





# Art is a dynamic and successful subject at Reddam House Berkshire, and students will be assessed via a portfolio of achievement and Art Scholars at Reddam House Berkshire play a leading role in artistic lessons, activities, and events, and usually commit extra time during breaks or after school in order to produce work of the highest standard. They should show the level of interest reasonably expected of Art Scholars in the work of artists, art galleries, and museums, and seek to become an Expressive

Arts Leader in the school either through an elected position, coaching or mentoring of younger students, or otherwise take a leading role in the Art Department. Scholarship recipients should choose Art as a GCSE option and, for

### **NSOULI SCHOLARS**

We are also delighted to offer the Nsouli Scholars programme from the academic year 2024/25 onwards, offered by Inspired Education's founder and CEO, Nadim Nsouli.

In Year 7 and above

• Excelling in two of Inspired Education's three pillars, one of which must be Academic Excellence

A selection of scholarships will be awarded to students of Lebanese origin; the country of birth of Inspired's CEO and founder, Nadim.

All scholarships of this kind will be focused on supporting students with limited means who would otherwise not have the opportunity to benefit from an Inspired Education at a leading school such as Reddam House Berkshire.



#### **SCHOLARSHIP CONDITIONS**

Scholarship awards have a maximum value of 20% remission of the Reddam House Berkshire tuition fee. It is the school's usual policy to limit the value of awards to 20%; should a student sit for more than one type of scholarship application and is successful in more than one, then the combined value of all awards will not exceed 20%, although they will be entitled to the full prestige of all the awards won.

### OCCASIONAL PLACE SCHOLARSHIP

From time to time, we receive applications for occasional places in non-natural years of entry (outside of Years 7, 9, and 12) at various points in the academic year. Depending on availability, we are prepared to consider applications for places, as well as scholarships from outstanding individuals in any year group above Year 3.

## CONDITIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The student who is awared a scholarship is required to work hard, contribute positively to the life of the school, be a credit to the school, and set a good example to other students. They must adhere to the school's required standards of conduct and progress. All Reddam House Berkshire pupils are expected to give 100% effort, immerse themselves into school life, and contribute to the school community. However, the expectations of award recipients are particularly high, and Scholars are expected to live up to those expectations and set the highest standards.

All Reddam House Berkshire Scholars are expected to:

 Meet the level of effort reasonably expected of a award recipient - obtain very high grades in the Attitudes to Learning assessments across the whole curriculum, and show great determination and strive to be the best they can be

• Make the level of commitment reasonably expected of award recipients to the area of school life in which they have been granted a scholarship, for example plays, ensembles, concerts, practice, fixtures, shows, exhibitions, and clubs

 Act as a role model within the wider school context and set an aspirational and outstanding example for other students to follow - this will include coaching or mentoring younger students

Act always as an ambassador for the school by attending all relevant at fixtures, concerts,
Open Mornings, plays, and any other requested functions

• Seek wider experiences from involvement with relevant clubs, teams, societies, and groups beyond school; read around the subject area, undertake further research, and demonstrate a continual enthusiasm to develop knowledge, skills, and understanding.
